FOREWORD

"Franz Schubert (1797-1828) wrote eight concert overtures, all contemporary with his first six symphonies. These early orchestral works were composed for amateur orchestras. In them he imitated two other Viennese composers, Haydn and Mozart, yet adding his own lyric touch. He created music of a bouyant nature, graced with a melodic appeal that is truly Schubertian.

This overture is one of his earliest manifestations as an orchestral composer. He was probably fifteen years old when he wrote it. Already he wished to create a large symphonic sound such as he was to utilize so magnificently in his great Symphony No. 9 in C Major.

Notice the extended positions necessary in the violin parts, the extravagant use of the trombones, and the dramatic use of dynamics, particularly toward the close of the work. Here we have the brilliant, young Schubert, bursting with vivid ideas which ultimately were to place him among the immortals of music."
